## President Report

It is my pleasure to present the 2020-21 Annual Report of the Williamstown Swimming and Life Saving Club, in our one hundred and first year as an organisation vested in providing safety for the swimming public of Williamstown Beach.

The impact of Covid-19 continues and I would like to acknowledge that many of our members will be going through a tough time brought on by the extraordinary event of the past year. While we are not able to offer the full facilities of the clubhouse, WSLSC will always be there to support our community and our members, which was demonstrated this throughout the season.

The Club Board has been made up of many great individuals, some new to the role, others with several years of experience, a combination that brought new ideas and wisdom to the club. We set ourselves the tasks of maintaining what makes us a great club while at the same time seeking new ways to add value and relevance to our local and extended communities. Even though our season has had interruptions, looking back, we still managed to achieve a lot.

This season WSLSC celebrated 101 years patrolling the beach and serving the community. In the delivery of this service we can proudly say we maintained the position of - no lives lost. However, it has been and continues to be a tough year for many. Our patrollers worked under exceptional circumstances adhering State Government Covid-19 requirements whilst keeping Williamstown Beach a safe environment for our local community. To all the Williamstown patrolling members thank you once again for your service, your commitment and your continued community dedication.

Once again the club continued its high standard of training of Bronze awards, SRC awards, IRB Drivers award and IRB Crew, ensuring we maintained qualified patrollers across our patrols. This training was only made possible through the dedication and skill of our many trainers, assessors and facilitators.

Skilling the next generation of lifesavers is one of our most important roles and we are fortunate to have the support of all our great Nipper and Starfish Committee. Together with the Age Managers, this team overcame the uncertainty of Covid-19 restrictions and delivered an incredible program to service to our community. Welcome and congratulations to all our new Nipper and Starfish families who have joined our wonderful club.

We know that the pandemic has had a big impact on mental health and wellbeing. A first for our Club, we held a Mental Health Information Session with invited leaders from a range of other community clubs, and the general public. This initiative was proudly funded by the Hobson's Bay Community Fund and the Williamstown Swimming and Life Saving Club.

Arguably the most significant announcement for this Club in its 101 years, is the State Government funding of \$11.35 million for the redevelopment of the Club facilities. These funds are in addition to funds previously committed by the Hobsons Bay City Council. The club has been lobbying all levels of government for this investment for many years and finally all our efforts have come to fruition. With funding now secured, the Club has started working with Council on the development of more detailed plans. It has been a long journey to get to this point with past Presidents, Board members and members strongly advocating for the upgrade. Our centenary celebrations last year captured how far the club has come and the upgrade will set us on an exciting path for the next 100 years. Our club will have the modern state of the art facilities critical for running our important service to community.

WSLSC board made the decision to offer its valued members free membership due to the pandemic and uncertainty of the 2020/21 season. Due to periods of eased restrictions, revenue raising events such as the WOW swim and school programs were able to be completed. Both State and Federal government Covid-19 stimulus grants helped with the general up keep of the clubhouse,





additional cleaning and life saving equipment required for patrols. Our club remarkably, in such a difficult year, had approx 20% membership increase. All these factors, combined with many members still paying their membership or making donations, enabled the club to post a small loss for 20/21 season. As president, myself and club secretary, Rod Seeber, certify that the enclosed financial statements are a “true and fair” view of the WSLSC financial position.

Our sponsors input has been invaluable in maintaining our programs to support members. The contribution of sponsors has allow us to maintain our school education programs, assist with vital first aid equipment, nippers programs and overall lifesaving operations. The Club would like to thank Port of Melbourne, Beacon Lighting, Williams Real Estate, Orbit Logistics, Grace, Jim’s Storage, Engine Swimwear, Symmetry, Peter Sadler Removal’s, FFLA and Hobsons Bay Council for their support.

WSLSC continues its objective to position our club to be the community’s club. Our primary purpose will always be as a surf lifesaving club; however with approximately 1,571 members we can always strive to do more. Once again am very proud of the club’s efforts this year off the beach with community engagement.

A special thank you to the WSLSC Board for their hard work, commitment and resilience in a challenging year.

And finally thank you to WARC, Sub-committee members, Age Managers, trainers, officials, coaches, assessors, active patrolling members, and all those who lend a helping hand around the club – our great community club would not exist without you!

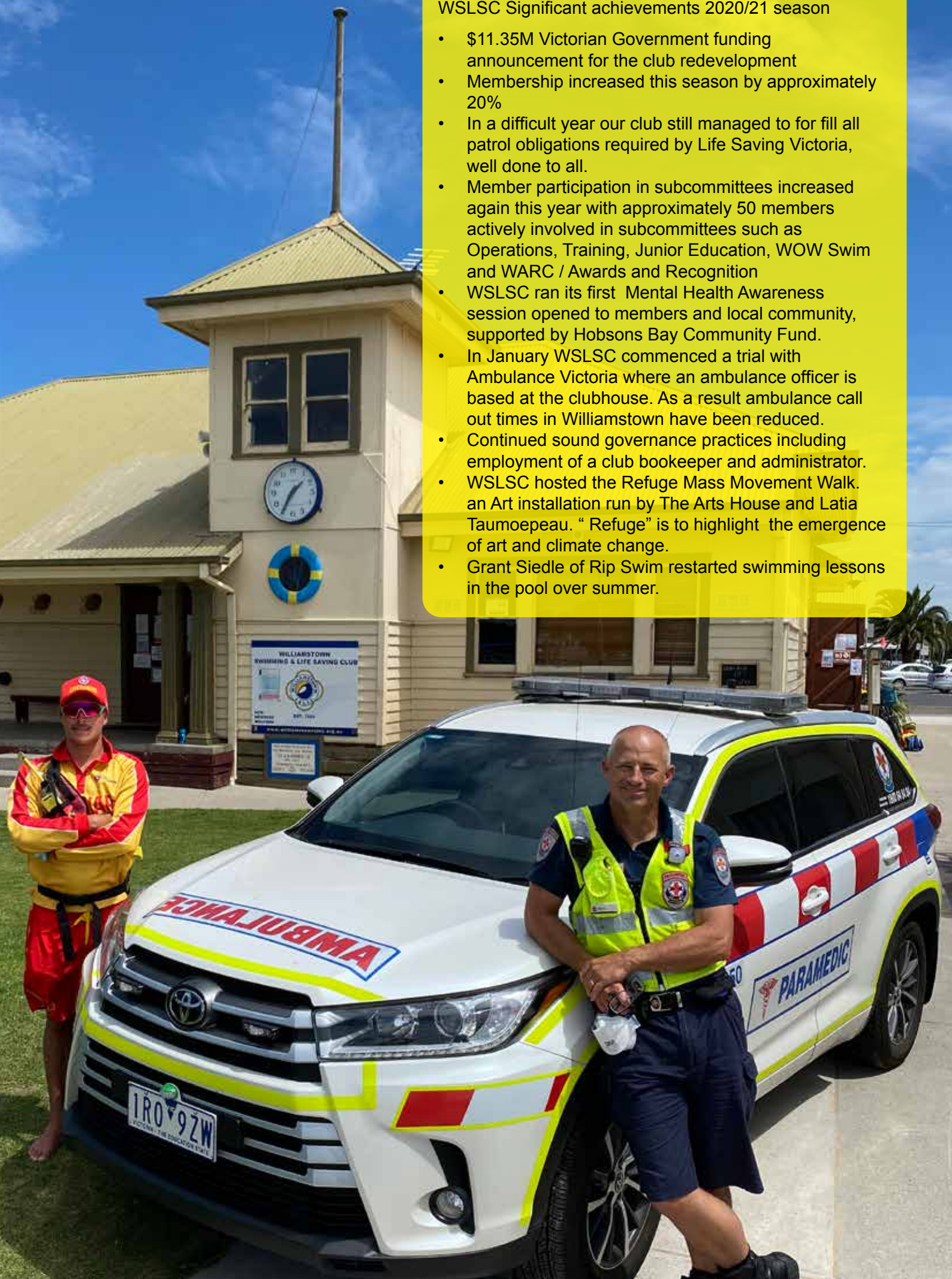

## WSLSC Significant achievements 2020/21 season

- \$11.35M Victorian Government funding announcement for the club redevelopment
- Membership increased this season by approximately 20%
- In a difficult year our club still managed to for fill all patrol obligations required by Life Saving Victoria, well done to all.
- Member participation in subcommittees increased again this year with approximately 50 members actively involved in subcommittees such as Operations, Training, Junior Education, WOW Swim and WARC / Awards and Recognition
- WSLSC ran its first Mental Health Awareness session opened to members and local community, supported by Hobsons Bay Community Fund.
- In January WSLSC commenced a trial with Ambulance Victoria where an ambulance officer is based at the clubhouse. As a result ambulance call out times in Williamstown have been reduced.
- Continued sound governance practices including employment of a club bookkeeper and administrator.
- WSLSC hosted the Refuge Mass Movement Walk. an Art installation run by The Arts House and Latia Taumoepeau. "Refuge" is to highlight the emergence of art and climate change.
- Grant Siedle of Rip Swim restarted swimming lessons in the pool over summer.

This year our mental health has been taking a pounding. But this issue is being talked about openly and hopefully more honestly. The wider mental health discussion highlights the importance of community and the Club was very proud to gain funding and share mental health awareness sessions in an effort to support not only members but the wider community.

Throughout everything, via screens and from behind masks, the Board has continued to meet, driving the Club forward despite the state grinding to a halt. I'm not going to lie, sometimes it was tough. Sometimes it seemed a little pointless. Making plans. Postponing events. Negotiating ever changing restrictions. Endless rearranging. But every single member of the Board stuck at it and dug deep. So, it was truly a light at the end of the tunnel to hear of the Club's successful award of funding for the new Club facilities. A culmination of many years of hard work and vision by others before, pushed over the line by Mark and Paul.

## Secretary Report

It is with great pleasure that I submit my annual report for 2020/21.

This year, as a result of COVID-19, and as we continue to live with the threat of further contagions, our club has endured lockdowns where our members were effectively forbidden access to the clubrooms and the club surrounds. Lockdowns also affected services to our members and the community to some degree. This is unprecedented in our history, and it has not been an easy time for anyone, and I thank all members for your understanding and for your outstanding loyalty.

It was due to the COVID restrictions imposed by Government that last year, the Directors decided to waive membership fees for one year. This was done in the knowledge that many of our members had been affected by job losses, and so may not have been able to renew their memberships. We hope our action has assisted those whose employment was affected over this period.

As a result of our actions with membership fees, our membership continues to grow strongly with 1571 current members, this is an increase of 311 from last year.

As I write this report and reflect on the year, I am pleased to say that we have continued to open the Club to the wider community of Williamstown. Hosting boot camps, the WOW swim, hall hire, community lectures for mental health, swim groups such as the Mussels, Dolphins, Belugas, Jellyfish, Little Rippers Learn to Swim, and many others. All of these groups enjoyed our Club and were welcomed.

As we broaden our activities and grow, we have found the need (last year) to employ Simeone Logan on a casual basis to assist with administrative duties, and so, as we continue to expand this year we will employ Daria Hewitt as our bookkeeper. Her skills will be invaluable as we progress with the construction of our new Clubhouse in the coming year.

The important role of Member Protection Officer has been exceptionally performed for us by Steve Schuurmans. Regretfully, Steve has advised the Club that he would like to step away from the role, and on behalf of the Board and Members I thank him for his dedication and the professionalism he brought to the role.

Lastly, I would like to thank our President Paul Sullivan for his outstanding leadership over the last twelve months. It is a role that he carries with distinction. Also, to the hard working Directors and those volunteers who get things done around the club without fanfare. We are all indebted to you.

## Treasurer Report

The results show that unsurprisingly in 2021 the Club made a small loss of \$3,722 (2020 surplus \$97,644), however bank balances remained steady at \$552,857 (2020 \$517,638).

There was still quite a strong revenue stream even with Covid-19 and its many lockdowns. Despite the Club's decision to waive membership fees quite a few members chose to pay part or all of their membership fees or make a donation to the club along with a lot of new members taking up the offer of a 50% reduction in fees. The club also received \$20,000 from the government cash boost program because of having employees (pool lifeguards and schools program coaches). There was also a good result from the WOW swim (mainly driven by strong sponsorship numbers) and the schools program performed very well in difficult circumstances

During the year the following major capital expenditure was possible:

- New training equipment \$4,333 purchased with grant money
- Second hand surfboat \$15,000 following increased interest in surfboats which has lead to many new active members at the club
- New commercial grade bar fridge costing \$3,509 to replace our old bar fridge that was continually breaking down and destroying stock

There were also smaller purchases including a new Life Member honour board, a new shade sail (from grant money), a blower (from grant money) and a pressure washer for buildings and grounds maintenance.

Of the \$33,524 of grant money received during the year there was \$2,000 from the Australian Communities Foundation for the provision of mental health first aid training not yet expended at year end plus \$2,596 from a 2019 Vibrant Community Grant.

Interest income from the term deposits was \$5,278 (2020 \$7,423). The Club has continued to roll the two term deposits for 12 month terms. Following the end of the financial year one term deposit has been rolled for 12 months with an additional \$25,000 (it matures in May 2022). These monies are being set aside for the future redevelopment of the club.

Overall a positive outcome in a very challenging time and the club remains in a strong financial position going forward.

# Notes to the Financial Statements

## Williamstown SLSC

### For the year ended 30 April 2021

#### 1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (Vic). The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

#### Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and property, plant and equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

#### Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

#### Cash on Hand

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

#### Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

#### Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

### Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

### Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

# Operations & training

Firstly, I would like to thank all the patrollers for the amazing effort put into making the season so successful!

### Patrol statistics

Our volunteer patrollers served over 100,000 beach goers throughout the season, which is significantly higher than previous seasons!

As a result of increased beach attendances, we recorded an increase in preventative actions to 1,410. This is a fantastic achievement, especially with the restrictions put in place due to COVID-19.

We've also seen a decrease in recorded first aid cases (39, down from 93). This clearly highlights the importance and amazing work our teams do on the beach each weekend.

### Patrol hours

Overall, we've had members dedicate 2,136.87 volunteer patrol hours throughout the season. A key highlight is that we've seen a decrease in the average hours per patroller (17.66 hrs, down from 21.53 hrs), which indicates a strong patrol group and our ability to successfully spread the workload across our patrolling members.

### Volunteer training

## YOUNG LIFESAVER'S HEROIC RESCUE SHINES LIGHT ON NIPPERS PROGRAM

Layla Pretorius – a Nipper from Williamstown Swimming and Life Saving Club (SLSC) – has been recognised as an Everyday Lifesaver for her courageous rescue of a teenager at risk of drowning late last year.

Awarded to people who have used their lifesaving and water safety skills to perform a significant rescue, at just 11 years old, Layla is one of the youngest Everyday Lifesavers to date.



While playing in the shallows at Williamstown, Layla heard a mother screaming – her son had drifted past the rocks and fallen out of his kayak, unable to get back in.

Immediately recognising the seriousness of the situation, Layla paddled out to the boy on her Nippers board, instructing him to hold the strap and kick while she paddled back into shore.

The boy was reunited with his mother and thankfully, nobody was injured.

During a recent ceremony to recognise Layla's heroic rescue at Williamstown SLSC, Club President Paul Sullivan said Layla's actions were not only a testament to her courage, but also the benefits of the Nippers program.

Throughout this season, as Director of Communications I have strived to provide the most up-to-date information to our members, utilising the TeamApp platform to regularly supply relevant information to members about Club activities. To date, over 1400 members make use of the TeamApp site and app to receive information about the Club, which has resulted in better notification of opportunities and information throughout the 2020/21 season.

Whilst we have had a very much atypical season, there has been plenty to celebrate at the Club, from our Mental Health sessions, successes in competition and other achievements, which has allowed for a great stream of content to be showcased to both members and the public through our social media sites such as Facebook and Instagram. Our social media sites and followings have allowed the Club to be seen by nearly 70000 people over the past 12 months, with our online following showing growth in both Facebook and Instagram over the past year.

The events of the last 12 months, and with the upcoming 2021/2022 season and beyond, have shown that Williamstown S&LSC has accomplished a lot in a short period of time, and has the potential to grow even more. ### HERO TEENS BACK ON THE BEAT

TWO teen heroes who saved three children stranded at sea are ready to log on for duty as beach lifesavers return to Port Phillip Bay this weekend.

Ryan King and Nick Friday – whose heroic while-off-duty save recognised this week – will this season pull on the red and yellow at Williamstown Swimming & Life Saving Club.

The 17-year-olds joined a plus for beachgoers to head safety warnings after months away from the water.

There have been at least a half dozen rescues recently even though summer hasn't started.

Ryan, who helped two of the three boys to safety when their stand-up paddleboards were swept offshore in strong wind, said the dramatic rescue was a lesson in how dangerous Port Phillip Bay could be.

"It opens up your eyes to how bad it can get so quickly – and especially at a bay beach," he said.

"There are definitely ways of getting in trouble even though there are no big waves."

"They had no idea they were in trouble and then as soon as they tried to get back in they couldn't with the wind."

"I think it proved to everyone there who was watching as well that it is quite dangerous."

"The kids were pretty thankful – it was a pretty hairy position to be in," he said. "People should look at the weather conditions and play it safe around the water – if you're even in doubt don't go out."

Life Saving Victoria president Paul James on Thursday awarded Ryan and Nick with the Everyday Lifesaver awards.

Mr James said lifesavers returned to the bay this weekend with those at coastal beaches back by November 28. It was vital beachgoers played their part in staying safe, he said.

"We want all Victorians to take the lead from lifesavers like Ryan and Nick this summer. Stay safe and prepare before heading to the water," Mr James said. "Whenever possible, swim at a patrolled beach between the red and yellow flags. Remember, if we can see you, we

## WOW Schools Program

(Perhaps taking lessons from some of the those cold loving open water swimmers who seem to have multiplied in the past year or so!) We were able to assess our attending Grade 6's for their Victorian Water Safety Certificates and provide those with the appropriate skills this important water safety certificate.

We were also privileged to provide a water safety and first aid course for the local group known as CReW (Coastal Rowing Williamstown) and some invited CALD community members. These amazing women have over three years, built a St Ayles Skiff Rowing Boat (Scottish), and have been training and racing in regattas (as able). But not only that, they have formed a womens' community group enabling the members to develop building skills and trusting and strong relationships. We hope to see CReW around the bay in the future.

Going forward, we are currently almost booked out for Term 4 this year, with more dates available in Term 1 (the water is warmer then too!) We are always on the look out for more member coaches and lifeguards who will be available for programs. This is a great program for both our students and coaches alike, where our trained members get to give back to our local students the knowledge and skills that make a great lifesaver, but also could help save a life.

## Open Water Swimming

It's been tough! we have all been on our own journeys of self-discovery over the past 18 months or so. I genuinely hope that each one of you have found some reward from the extra time at home, whether it is connection with your children, discovering a new hobby or pastime or writing that book you've always had ready to go.

I have had swimming as my one constant. I live 190 meters from the water and my land bubble has been limited but my water bubble has been vast. I have found the bay to be the one place where I am able to clear my mind of all other things and spend an hour re setting the monkey mind and clearing the junk files. For me swimming is much more than a sport or fitness pursuit. Swimming offers me rest, relaxation, joy and connection to community and an all-encompassing sense of well-being.

There have always been a number of supportive swim group communities around the bay and beyond, but it seems in hard times that new micro bubble groups are forming organically as support networks for daily swimmers to rely upon. Groups are a lovely safe way to connect with likeminded saltwater tribe and general swim folk. Swimming carries a level of risk, particularly during the cooler months when water temps can drop as low as 9 degrees Celsius. Swimmers in general will always look out for each other and swim speed and distance covered is always set by the slowest or least confident swimmer. This is never something that is talked about and is simply accepted as best practice.

Swim groups are quirky with names such as: The Mussels, The Dolphins, The Jellyfish, The Belugas, The Pink caps, Icebergers of many forms, Bay Open Water Swimmers, The Intrepids, The Sloths, Bellywhackers (online community) and many more. Many have mascots, specialised kit or uniform, pre and post swim rituals that encourage inclusivity, respect, and a welcoming community philosophy. ## Nippers

With the ever changing COVID situation, the Williamstown S&LSC was delighted to be able to offer a modified COVID-Safe Nippers program for our 2020-21 season. In line with COVID requirements of the time, our Nippers sessions ran from late January to February 2021.

Our Nippers program attracted around 250 Nippers to our Sunday morning sessions. Many were returning Nippers and we were also happy to see a large number of new Nippers joining in for the first time. Our Starfish Program was also offered (at a later time in line with COVID requirements) and attracted a high number of participants – a credit to the amazing work of Veronica, Bron and her amazing team of volunteers.

Our Age Group Managers comprised of a mix of returning age managers from previous seasons and new age managers who were happy to take on the role of leading our groups of Nippers. We were also fortunate to have strong engagement from many of Williamstown S&LSC emerging leaders - our Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) holders. Our SRC holders have come through the ranks of Nippers and gone on to join our Junior and Senior Competition teams. Each of our SRC team worked with our Nipper age groups (and were a big help to our Age Managers) by demonstrating surf skills and techniques (including how to wade and the best way to complete flag starts). We received incredible feedback from parents (and Nippers!) about the involvement of our SRC leaders in our Nippers Program and this is an aspect of our program we intend to build on for our upcoming season.

A highlight of our season was our Emergency Services Day, which was attended by Ambulance Victoria, Victoria Police and the Westpac Lifesaver Rescue Helicopter. The kids loved sitting in the vehicles and helicopter and asked lots of questions. Our Under 8 Nippers had a great tug-o-war challenge with attending police and parents.

Thank you to all our volunteers who assisted make this season – our Age Group Managers, Water Safety personnel, SRC helpers, swim assessors, membership services, first aid crew and other helpers on the days – we wouldn't have a program without your efforts and contributions. We aim to engage with families in the development and implementation of our program and we are looking for more parents to be part of our sub-committee to contribute to the development of our Nippers program. ## Starfish Nippers

The 2020/21 season was certainly the season that was!!! The Starfish Nipper program this year ran from Jan 24th to Feb 21st, providing each young person with a disability a hands-on introduction to the nipper's program. They only wanted to get in the water on the boards, but they enjoyed learning about safety & rules going to the beach, through games and visual aids.



Our Starfish Nippers program was heavily impacted by both COVID-19 shut downs and poor water quality, following substantial rain in late January. As a result, we only managed 3 sessions for the season, which was really disappointing.

Despite that, community interest in the program escalated this year, with a remarkable 17 participants, 4 new families and an additional 5 families registering, but unable to commit with the lockdown uncertainty, promising to return next season.

Feedback from the families, was all positive, despite the reduced sessions. Being part of an inclusive & fun community environment at Williamstown Swimming & Lifesaving club was what made them return and attracted new families. To see children in session 1 who wouldn't even put their feet in the water, to be the first ones racing for the boards and not wanting to come back to the shore, after just 3 sessions, is totally what the program hopes to achieve. Our volunteer support this season was amazing. We had 27 volunteers registering for the Program this year, 5 who were volunteering for the first time. Our volunteers make the program. The 1:1 ratio of volunteer to participant, allows parents to just be parents, able to enjoy watching their children have fun in the water, without having to worry about their safety. They can take photos, have a cuppa and network with other parents. This support is immeasurable. We had the Emergency Services visit the group on the last day of the Program, including the Life Saving Victoria helicopter. Whilst it was great for the majority of participants, the noise is often challenging for some of our Starfish Nippers, who still participated, but from a distance.



We'd like to extend a big thank you to all the mentors/volunteers who supported the Starfish Nipper Program. There's a lot that goes on behind the scenes, but without dedication and ongoing commitment to attending Sunday mornings, the Program would not run. It's that commitment and guidance in providing a safe and fun environment for Starfish Nippers participants to develop and grow, that makes this such a successful program.

We look forward to the Starfish Nipper program growing further, and providing many more opportunities for young people with disabilities in the community, to engage with our Lifesaving Club.

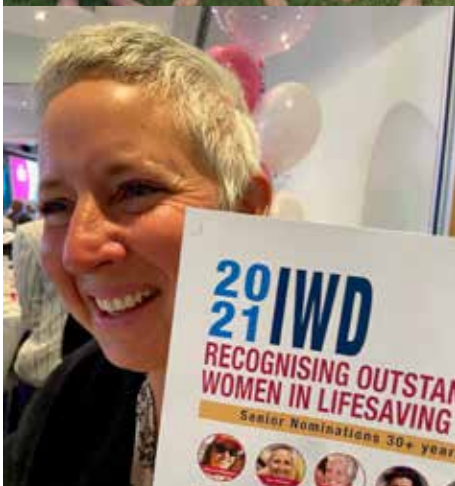
