It is with great pleasure I present this 102nd Annual Report of the Williamstown Swimming & Life Saving Club on behalf of the Board for the 2021/22 season. For the third consecutive season, COVID-19 tried its best to disrupt Club activities. Fortunately, most of the public health restrictions came to an end in mid-December and Club life essentially returned to normal.

There is no doubt COVID-19 has changed the way we all live, work and play – perhaps forever. This includes the way our club meets its obligations as a volunteer community service, patrolling our beach, education and how skills improvement are delivered. WSLSC will always be there to support our community and our members, which was demonstrated once again throughout the season.

We are truly blessed with the calibre of our lifesavers. And their commitment. The leadership of the team has been exceptional ensuring that Williamstown Beach is a safe environment for our local community and all beach visitors. Our patrol leaders have continued to connect us to our beachgoers and our capabilities as lifesavers are highly regarded throughout the broader community. A few rescues and preventative actions have again resulted in keeping our beach safe and sound. That no lives were lost under our watch this year. To all the Williamstown patrolling members thank you for your vigilance and service, your efforts have been outstanding, and your community dedication is greatly appreciated.

The success of our Education and Lifesaving services at WSLSC are predominantly due to the management delivered by our Director of Training and her team of trainers and assessors. During the 2022 season Williamstown added over 124 new awards to the membership. An outstanding result for our club's future as saving lives is our primary purpose. We should all be very proud of the level of service we provide and the annual updates we deliver reeducating our members.

Congratulations to our dedicated Nipper Team who overcame an uncertain start to the season. The nipper program brought so much life and enthusiasm back to the club. Something we needed after the past few seasons once restrictions were relaxed. It was wonderful to see so many new faces actively participating in the running the program. Nippers are our club's future so well done to all involved in making this program a success.

Congratulations to all of our competitors proudly representing the Club. Our coaching in competition continues to establish and develop from the past seasons. It was positive to see large and increasing numbers of members participating at craft, swim and beach both at carnivals and training sessions. At the Victorian and Australian Championships, we had another fine season with some stellar results in all areas, Nippers, Seniors and Masters. Thank you to all the coaches who committed heavily in time and effort, to make sure everything went smoothly and all our competitors were well supported.

Our Club is heavily reliant on Sponsorships, Donations and Grants to support our mission; "To ensure no lives are lost while on patrol and to assist members to achieve their full potential whilst supporting the community". I would like to take this opportunity to thank our generous, donors and sponsorship partners for their ongoing support. This allows the Club to continue to provide lifesaving first aid, water safety education and supportive equipment. The Club would like to thank Port of Melbourne, Greg Hocking Elly Partners, Orbit Logistics, Grace, Jim's Storage, Engine Swimwear, Peter Sadler Removal's, FFLA, Victorian Government, Hobsons Bay Council, SLSA and Life Saving Victoria for their continued support.



A special thank you to the WSLSC Board for their hard work, commitment and resilience in a challenging year who have worked tirelessly behind the scenes this year. At the end of this surf lifesaving year, we bid farewell to several key Club Board members whom have contributed significantly to the improvement of our Club. Firstly, to Rod Seeber who has been the Club Secretary thank you for your support and service in this important area at the Club, and secondly, Joel Farrow Director of Communications, thanking you both.

Arguably the most significant announcement for this Club in its 102 years, is the State Government funding of \$11.35 million alongside additional funds from Hobsons Bay Council, for the redevelopment of the Club facilities. The club will continue to work closely with council on the future build. The project has started and progressed with council in the final stages of appointing an architect and design team in August.

WSLSC will always continue its objective to position our club to be the community's club. Our primary purpose will always be as a surf lifesaving club, however with approximately 1,570 members we can always strive to do more. Once again am very proud of the club's efforts this year off the beach with community engagement.

And finally thank you to WARC, Sub-committee members, age managers, trainers, officials, coaches, assessors, active patrolling members, and all those who lend a helping hand around the club – our great community club would not exist without you.

As previously advised, I will be stepping down from my role as President at the July Annual General Meeting. I look back on my tenure with a sense of achievement and pride. Like the legacy of Presidents before me, the Club is in better shape than what we inherited and I know that others will continue this progress into the future.

It has been an honour to serve my community and I have a terrific sense of achievement to have taken our Club forward. Williamstown Swimming & Life Saving Club has a proud history and a bright future and I am very gratified to be part of it.

WSLSC Significant achievements 2021/22 season

- \$11.35M Victorian Government and additional funds from Hobson Bay Council will provide a legacy build for future, council is to announce successful architect and design team in August, come on the journey.

- New club Utility and ATV purchases
- New Gym equipment and surf craft purchases.
- Several groups continue create a wonderful community hub at WSLSC, Top Boxing, Rip Swim, CarmenBody Yoga, Ambulance Victoria, ETPA, thank you.
- WSLSC hosted the inaugural Presidents Pre-Season Forum an initiative aimed at bringing ideas and working together towards advancing lifesaving.
- Continued sound governance practices, employment of a club bookkeeper and administrator continues.
- WSLSC Nippers Emergency Day continues to grow, a great opportunity to get up close and meet our emergency services in person.

Vice President Report

It was a slow emergence from lockdowns this year. I'm not sure any of us actually believe it, even now. But, emerge we have. And it is so good to feel the buzz building around the Club again.

Throughout everything the Club has remained an important hub for members and the wider community. Whether it was as a meeting point, a check in with a friendly face or an invigorating swim, people came together.

From dawn to dusk (and a little bit either side) on any given day the Club is in flux with our vibrant array of members and users. The open water swimmers power by or bob about, the Nippers train, play and squeal, families in tow. Training courses are run with participants practicing CPR, driving the beach vehicle or rescuing each other. Patrollers set up and manage the beach, providing water safety, lifesaving jet skis based at the Club cross the Bay. Surf skis and boards race in and out, SUPs paddle around. IRBs buzz back and forth, tight buoy turns, surf boats practice starts off the beach, learn to row crews wobble about. Marching, flags, R&R, running, school groups criss-cross the beach. Out on the grass exercise classes, triathlon training, sunbathing, picnics, introductory tours. Swimming lessons, police training, laps and family fun in the pool. Inside weights are pumped, yoga stretches, ambulance response base manned, meetings, parties, gatherings, bar, communal teas.

All the while motors are tinkered with, equipment cared for, buildings maintained, first aid stock reordered, floors cleaned, memberships managed, training courses organised, events planned and run, covid / policy updates made, damage fixed, rubbish put out, grass cared for, the odd fire laid as we descend into winter.

The Club is a fully volunteer run organisation. Every element of the Club occurs thanks to the generous time input of volunteers. There is something very special about this wonderful community and the Board is deeply grateful for the support provided by so many. Apart from the day to day and seasonal operations there has been much unacknowledged work in the background ensuring the Club has a stable foundation and an enduring future for all. It is a very exciting time to be part of the Club. We are very much looking forward to sharing the next stage of the journey with you.

Secretary Report

It is with great pleasure that I submit my annual report for 2022.

This year has been another challenging one, albeit better than the previous two years, and again our Club has seen many highlights. These range from the Nippers participation over summer, a successful WOW Swim, learn to swim lessons in the pool by Grant Siedle's Little Rippers program, the running of the annual Point to Point race which was won by our Junior Club Captain Brydie Logan, and the usage of the facilities by many community groups. These include the Mussels, Dolphins, Belugas and Jellyfish and the popular School's program. The school's program continues to grow and teach water safety to Primary School children, and we are all grateful for the hard work that Sally Leung puts into running the program. The Hall hire also continues to be popular, and is a great source of revenue for the Club. I thank all members for their patience and understanding when the hall is occupied by these activities.

This year I am proud to say the Directors resurrected the role of Junior Club Captain, and James O'Toole and Brydie Logan were elected in that role. James and Brydie have formed a Junior Board which meets quarterly and will advise the Directors on the junior needs of the Club. The Junior Board has met and attended a meeting of the Club Directors, and they were also hosted by Club sponsors the Port of Melbourne at a meeting at their headquarters in Docklands. The Club Directors see the Junior Board as a great step forward in training our junior members to be future leaders of the Club and community, and I wish them well.

The Club has not increased membership fees for two years, and our membership continues to grow strongly with over 1500 members. Another increase on last year.

I would like to thank our President Paul Sullivan for his outstanding leadership over the last twelve months. It is a role that he carries with much distinction. Also, to the hard working Directors and those volunteers who get things done around the club without fanfare. We are all indebted to you for your generosity.

Lastly, I have served our Club as Secretary for four years, and this year I have decided to take a break, and so I will not be nominating for the Secretary's position at the AGM. I am very proud of the work the Directors have achieved in that time, and I hope that I have contributed in a small way to that work.

Treasurer Report

As the club started to return to a somewhat normal season, so too did the club finances. For the 2021/22 season the Club made surplus of \$110,371 (2020/21 season had a loss of \$3,722), with bank balances increasing to \$671,788 from \$552,857 at the end of 2020/21.

Increased membership revenue was a noticeable change in income which is a result of a growth in membership numbers and the Club's decision to waive the 2020/21 membership fees. Event revenue also increased thanks to the successful running of the WOW swim and the schools program. The growth of the schools program resulted in increased expenditure on wages. The wage costs also included the new accounts officer and the growing role of the paid club administrator.

Many Victorian lifesaving clubs have experienced significant growth in membership following the redevelopment of their club facilities. The poor condition of the current club facilities is consistently a reason why members choose not to renew their membership so the Board expects a similar growth in membership will occur at our club. The club is starting to take steps to prepare for a larger membership including increased investment in paid staff roles in club administration and accounting.

Prudent financial management has the club well placed to deal with the financial impacts of the club redevelopment. The club has currently committed approximately \$200,000 to the club redevelopment (a financial contribution of \$180,000 and approx \$20,000 in fit out items such as recent club purchases of commercial fridges, furniture, etc). It is anticipated a fundraising process for the project will commence over the coming years.

The following is some of the key grant money received during the year

- \$15,000 from Surf Life Saving Australia Beach Safety Equipment Fund (BSEF) which was used for new operational equipment
- \$7,500 administration grant from Life Saving Victoria which was used for administration staff expenses
- \$5,320 from Victorian Government for insurance and cleaning support
- \$2,825 from Hobsons Bay for a covid recovery grant

For the coming financial year, the club is in the process of upgrading the club vehicle using a \$14,484 VESEP grant and a \$21,000 deposit was paid on a new surfboat reflecting the growing participation in surfboats within the club.

Overall a positive outcome with the club being in a strong financial position which is a good place to be in with the club redevelopment starting to take shape.

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (Vic). The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and property, plant and equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result ofpast events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflowcan be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required tosettle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

Cash on Hand

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.



Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in theassets and liabilities statement.

Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

Operations

The 2021/22 season started with a multitude of challenges for lifesaving operations thanks to the uncertainty of COVID 19, new award requirements for patrols and the late handover from the previous board. Being new in the role of Operations Director I felt I was playing catch-up for most of the season. Thankfully the former OD Alex Walton had done a sensational job and had established a strong patrolling culture within the club.

The patrol roster needed to be flexible to meet whatever changes might be imposed so we continued the 'casual' rostering system implemented last season. This allowed members to nominate when they would like to patrol rather than being rostered to set patrols with set dates. As with all things new it wasn't without its problems but on the whole this system was widely regarded as a success. We will make a few modifications to ease the workload of the poor person in charge of the roster and put a little more responsibility back onto the patrollers for future seasons.

Another new initiative was to create hot weather observation patrols on those midweek evenings when the hot temperature summoned many people to the cool water of the bay. We are hoping to expand this next season to include the warm spring days when the strong northerly winds push anything inflatable (and those on them) offshore.

The Training Team headed by Rebecca Cammeron had done a tremendous job over the summer upskilling many of our patrolling members. This made the task of filling our patrols with the necessary people and awards much easier. I must also thank Chloe Takac, Alastair Thomas and Leonie Newey. Alastair ensured the IRB was always ready for patrolling duties and organised the water safety duties for the WOW. Chloe was responsible for maintaining the first aid room and monitoring all first aid cases. While Leonie tackled the task of ensuring the logs were up to date.

A highlight of the season was the number of members who qualified for professional positions with LSV in a wide range of roles. Williamstown had representatives working in LSV communications, on the beach as Lifeguards, performing patrols on the RWCs (Rescue Water Craft), flying drones and patrolling from the air in the Westpac Rescue Helicopter.


Closer to home, some of our members patrolled a huge number of hours for Williamstown. Leading the count was Bruce Collins with over 117 hrs who happened to be the Patrol Captain when a couple of swimmers found themselves in serious trouble. If it wasn't for the actions of Bruce and Jason Thurley, we may well have had a double fatality on our beach.

Rebecca Cameron was the other member to crack the 100 hours of voluntary service with Neil Emmett right behind at over 92 hrs. Others who did more than 50 hours include Tom and James Frisby, Talia Roder and Chloe Takac. While these members provided a massive contribution, every hour that every patrolling member contributes is valued and appreciated. On behalf of the committee and the public who swim at Williamstown beach, I wish to thank every patrolling member for their efforts over the summer.

Looking to the future we have a sub committee investigating our operational needs and ensuring the new facilities will be functional for all our purposes. Our club vehicle is to be replaced and we will continue to source and maintain the best quality patrol equipment available. We have two SUPs for patrol duties and want to conduct a trial to have these potentially included as future rescue equipment. It is also a goal of ours to have a Williamstown team compete in the State Patrol Competition along with the First Aid and Champion Lifesaver Competition.

Finally I want to recognise and thank our outgoing president Paul Sullivan for his enthusiasm and encouragement. You have been a wonderful asset to the club Paul and have left a legacy for the future of the club.

Training

As Victoria emerged from Covid-19 restrictions in the latter half of 2021, opportunities for training at WS&LSC increased. Members enthusiastically stepped up and gained new awards, completed pre-season skills maintenance sessions, and ensured their first aid and emergency care skills were updated to meet current requirements. 13 different courses were delivered by the club, with 124 awards achieved directly by club members as a result of these courses. A further 67 lifesaving awards were also obtained by members through LSV or other clubs. This represents an amazing effort by the club to support fellow members, LSV and the local community.

Skills Maintenance: 21 skills maintenance sessions were held between November 2021 and mid January 2022. Skills sessions included SRC, BM, IRBC, IRBD and ART. 130+ club members participated in these sessions, with 40% of members maintaining their skills in 2 or more different awards. These sessions were also an opportunity to encourage patrolling members to practise skills during the season while on patrol. Special thanks go to the members of the training team for being available across so many sessions to ensure that as many members as possible were signed off prior to the peak patrol season.

Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC): This year WS&LSC were approached by LSV to host a Cultural and Linguistically Diverse (CALD) SRC course at the club. In the week between the school term finishing and Christmas the club conducted two week-long intensive SRC courses, with our 6 new club CALD members joining a group of 18 Nipper program graduates from WS&LSC and Altona LSC. Participants were put through their paces on the beach, in the open water and in the club pool gaining valuable rescue and resuscitation skills and becoming patrol ready club members. It was a pleasure to see the cohort working together throughout the course and to see these friendship bonds continue during the patrol season. It was also fantastic to see these new award holders helping out with Nipper water safety and on beach activities on Sunday mornings. Special thanks go to our wonderful training team for making themselves available at this busy time of year and to Michael Masseni from LSV for introducing us to our new CALD members and for assisting with the course during the week.

Surf Rescue Certificates: Cleo Creaney, Peta De Zilva, Jasper Devine, Oliver Devine, Saw Joshua George, Saw Justin George, Piya Gill, Nathaniel Glover, Ezra Hope, Jacob Howell, Lincoln Kelly, Sheli Lian, Mason Phillips (Altona), Madison Sonego, Shermula Tun Kin and July Lin Weeku. Matthew Hunt and Simone Phelan also attained their SRC at Altona and Anglesea this season. Monique Howell also attained her Resuscitation Award during the SRC intensive course.

Bronze Medallion: The club have offered 3 different Bronze Medallion courses this season, including the longest running Bronze course ever (affectionately dubbed the 'boaties bronze course'), a pre-Christmas intensive Bronze running concurrently with the SRC course and a mid-Feb start course. These courses catered for a range of participants, including new members keen to participate in surfboat rowing competitions, current SRC holders now old enough to undertake the Bronze course, members wishing to assist with patrol duties and parents wanting to assist with providing water safety at junior carnivals and competitions. There were many Covid-19 disruptions to the Boaties Bronze which impacted on the length of the course and poor water quality prevented completion of the mid-Feb course water based assessments as planned. This means that we still have a further three club members who are part way through completing their Bronze assessment. Thank you to all participants for stepping up and attaining your Bronze - this is the foundation award for our patrols and is the prerequisite for many of the other SLSA awards. Again special thanks to the Training Team members for your incredible efforts delivering these courses.

IRB (inflatable rescue boats) crew and driver courses were held over a couple of weekends in late March. These courses were very popular, reflecting the desire of experienced patrol and competition IRB crew members to upskill to become drivers and the enthusiasm of the new Bronze patrollers to get their crew qualifications for patrolling and joining the winter IRB comp team. The highlight of the courses was the final day at Ocean Grove, where the course participants were joined by members of the IRB competition team, gaining valuable experience operating the boats in the surf and learning about IRB racing techniques. Special thanks to the IRB comp team and the parents of all the young course participants for the assistance with transport arrangements and making the surf day possible.

Jason Thurley also attained his Driver award on an LSV course in March.

Silver Medallion Beach Management courses were not held at the club in the last 12 months. Chelsea Coulson, Jesse Coulson and Jason Thurley all obtained their SMBM awards this season through courses offered by Half Moon Bay LSC and Sandridge LSC. LSV has advised that a new Silver Medallion Patrol Captain award will be introduced in the lead up to the 2022-2023 season – we will keep members informed about this new award as we learn more about it and what this means for members who already hold the SMBM award.

Gold Medallion: Congratulations to Stacey Cockram for attaining her Gold Medallion this season. The training team are investigating opportunities and what forward planning needs to be undertaken to offer a club Gold Medallion course in the future.

First Aid and Advanced Resuscitation Techniques (ART) courses: In July 2021, LSV introduced new modules for both First Aid and ART, and introduced a combined ART/First Aid course. As a result, the training team conducted an audit of club first aid and ART award holders to determine which active patrol members would need to undertake the three-yearly award update and to identify additional members interested in doing these awards for the first time. For the first course in December, we combined resources with Altona LSC and our member participants hosted by Steven Cordina over two evenings at Altona. In late April, we again combined resources with Altona and WS&LSC hosted a second ART/FA course. The skills audit also identified a number of members who had already updated their First Aid awards and were now eligible to update or upgrade to the ART award, so we also ran an ART only award at WS&LSC in mid-June. We were fortunate to have a visit from Marcus Stacey during the ART course and benefited from his paramedic insights on techniques and responding to an on-beach scenario. The training team plan to offer a regular series of Resuscitation, First Aid and ART courses throughout the year to ensure that members skills are fully up to date at the start of the patrol season. A significant number of club members also took advantage of the first aid training courses offered directly by LSV or via their own workplaces throughout the year.



Since September 2021, 56 club members updated their first aid or attained new first aid awards. A further 12 members have awards that are still current but will need to be updated to the new modules in the coming 12 months. The club now also has 45 club members with updated or new ART awards, which is a fantastic improvement from only 20 members able to be rostered for ART at the start of the patrol season.

Side-by-Side Vehicle (SSV) Operator course: This season LSV introduced a new award for members operating the club's all-terrain vehicle (ATV). The training team were very fortunate that several experienced trainers gained their SSV award at Hampton LSC and then headed to Williamstown to start the daunting task of delivering this new course to everyone who will need it before the start of the 2022-2023 season. The training team ran two courses in April, with 25 new awards achieved across the two courses. The club now has four new facilitators for this course and plans to offer regular courses from now to the lead-up to the new patrol season.

Pool Lifeguard courses: The club was notified that LSV were offering subsidised pool lifeguard courses as part of their campaign to address the lack of trained pool lifeguards in Victoria. 11 WSLSC members took up this opportunity to obtain their Pool Lifeguard awards and we look forward to seeing them all on the pool deck in the summer of 2022-2023. The Training Team will continue discussions with LSV regarding facilitating yearly lifeguard refresher training for all of our pool lifeguard award holders.

Equipment: The club was successful in obtaining a number of grants this season and some of those grants facilitated the purchase of additional equipment for use in training courses. New equipment includes additional spinal boards, pocket masks, an additional AED trainer, partial leg wound training models with tourniquets and haemostatic dressings for treating severe bleeds, OP airway insertion trainers, manual suction kits, Ana-pen trainers,



compression and snake bite management bandages and a bleeding wound moulage kit complete with artificial blood. This new equipment is particularly valuable as it helps the club teach modules with newly introduced and reinstated techniques across several courses.

Training at the club would not be possible without the continued efforts of our wonderful team of Trainers, Assessors and Facilitators. We are most grateful to our more experienced members of the team for their continued mentoring of the team and for everyone in the team who is willing to put time into preparing for and delivering such a wide range of courses.

This season we were fortunate to add several new members to the team, including 4 trainee trainers (3 members who completed the Training Officer Course and a 1 x Cert IV holder) and 2 x BM Trainers. We also upskilled a number of other trainers and now have additional resources to deploy on courses, including 1 x IRB trainer, 2 x BM Assessors, 1 x IRB Assessor, 1 x BM Facilitator and 4 x SSV Facilitators. LSV recently offered opportunities for our TOC trainers to upgrade their training to include the assessor skillsets – Chloe Takac has taken up this offer and is currently completing the Assessors modules. Also of note this season is the willingness of senior patrol members to work with the training team, effectively picking up the training baton during patrols to assist new award holders apply and develop their skills on the beach.

On a personal note, I would also like to express my gratitude to Joel Farrow and Alex Walton for their never-ceasing support with my transition into the Training portfolio this season. Your knowledge, experience and willingness to mentor me in this new role have been outstanding.




Club Redevelopment

Season 2021/22 started with great excitement following the announcement in May 2021 of \$11.3M funding from the Victorian Government. Following this announcement there has been a frustrating process of project briefings and project planning. The Board, especially Paul Sullivan, has been actively pushing the process behind the scenes to keep the project moving including Council briefings, project partner meetings and most recently, project coordination meetings. Special thanks to the Member for Williamstown, Melissa Horne, who has been actively involved and extremely supportive through this process as well as the Council staff.

The project has started to gather momentum in recent months. Council is currently in the final stages of appointing an architect and design team team which is expected to be complete in August. The Council brief for the project noted the end design would be something along the lines of the following concept designs which were prepared by Council in consultation with the club in 2019 to assist with securing project funding.





The new architects will update these plans, and prepare a complete package of plans for consultation later this year. Council recently added the project to the <u>Council website</u> which will provide updates on the project progress. Members will be kept updated by the club once dates for consultation are known.

Teen lifesavers on patrol

Over recent years a number of new Life

Williamstown Open Water Schools Program

The WOW School programs commenced on November 15th this season. Once again it was a shaky start to our programs coming slowly out of lockdown and our start date of November 9th was delayed for a week. Our usual face to face coaches training was also missed due to indoor density restrictions. Luckily with our keen and well skilled coaching team, coaches were quickly up to date on their teaching knowledge and water safety education.

The weather was mainly kind to us this season, particularly in Term 1. Students were able to practice skills in rescues, boards (nipper and body boards), flags, safe water entry/safety skills in the pool, as well as learn first aid and CPR skills and of course have fun with beach and pool games! It is also observed that the teachers love attending these sessions!

This season we managed to put more than 1000 primary school students through our programs in November and December, and more than 400 in February/ March. Some students attended 1 day programs, some 2 days, and Newmarkt Primary students were lucky enough to attend a 1st term surf sports program once a week, right up to the start of April. It was great to see the improve in waters skills and confidence over that time.

We were also able to assess and pass more than 60 grade 6 students in their Victorian Water Safety Certificate (done on request from the school during their program). The Victorian Water Safety Certificate is a Victorian Government initiative which describes specific water safety competencies that should be achieved by the time students reach the end of primary school. Our students come from a mix of local Primary Schools including many of our regular nippers (Williamstown Primary, Williamstown North, Newport Lakes, St Marys, Newmarkt), and others from surrounding suburbs (St Leo the Great, Kensington, Salt Water College). We also hosted swim carnival and training times for local schools. It is always great fun to watch the house coloured students cheering each other on up and down the pool.

This year our coaches were a mixture of new and old faces. Our new younger coaches were able to assist with additional water safety and shadow shifts, with our more experienced coaches stepping up to Team Lead and supervise the team, as well as provide one on one assistance to special needs students. Thank you to Nick and Tom Frisby and Jesse Coulson for keeping the team together and fun and learning going throughout the season. And thank you to the rest of the team for your dedication and expertise in making our WOW Schools Program such a wonderful learning environment for aquatic safety for our students. I can see that you all gained teaching and employability skills too.

If you would like to be involved in the WOW Schools Program as a coach this coming season, we are always looking for additional coaches. What do you need? - Minimum age of 16 years, A current bronze medallion, Working with Childrens' Check and a love and passion to teach water safety to students! We also need a lifeguard for each session if this suits you. Lastly if you are interested in assisting to co-ordinate and contributing to the program in other ways, I would love to hear from you. Open Water Swimming

I have just returned from a wet and wild swim camp on the NSW South coast where flood records have once again been broken. It's lovely to be able to travel and investigate new swim locations again but is also a strong reminder of just how lucky we are to live here in Melbourne where our climate is relatively stable.

Bay swimming continues to grow quickly, and it feels like many swimmers now use the pool as a secondary location with the OW being their focus whenever possible. There would hardly be a day that goes past without seeing swimmers out between the poles off Willy lapping up all the benefits that come with a cool water swim.

I saw a peak water temperature recorded at 26.4c this past summer season with temperatures currently hovering back in the 10's and it is that range of water temperature that offers a real challenge to many of us. If we have chosen the bay as our swim base, we either choose to embrace the temperature variations with enthusiasm or simply give up. Being comfortable in the water is important and wearing gear that gets you to that state is vital. Being cold, anxious and or panicky in the water is not a good scenario and is to be avoided at all costs. Having said that, embracing a little discomfort can unlock superpowers that you may not have been aware you possessed. Try a swim in the shallows without your suit after completing your main suited swim, always swim with a buddy and set a little cool water challenge together. There are so many "big ticket" swim goals that the smaller ones can go unrecognised. I am always much more inspired by the little breakthroughs and seeing the difference that achieving micro goals can make to an individual.

Those red lions'-mane jellies were living their best lives last season and created lots of "jelly-talk" over the socials. It is important to remember that we as humans are the problem, not the jellies. With continuing poor farming practices, inability to capture water and allow run off via our road and drainage system, general pollution, and global warming all compound to increase nutrient levels and creating desirable conditions for phytoplankton and algal blooms along with spikes in jelly-fish populations. We are all going to have to learn to live with the jellies or start to make changes at a grass roots and individual level.

The swim event calendar was back in place last season, and it was lovely to see another hugely successful WOW event showing strong participation numbers. Many other events were cancelled or postponed due to poor weather or lack of volunteer staff due to covid outbreaks but in general it was a much more "normal" season. I would expect this coming Summer season to be busier than ever as we all begin our move back into more normal rhythm From a "swim group" perspective, it's been wonderful to see so many swimmers at the beach every Saturday morning. This has extended into the winter as well, and it is terrific to see some of the club's better known swim groups (The Mussels and The Willy Dolphins) being joined from pre-dawn hours through to lunchtime, by a huge variety of other groups each week. These groups vary in size, origin, and purpose, and it is great to see a camaraderie across their memberships as we all share personal and group experiences, a well-earned cuppa, and the club facilities too. 
