Our club continues to grow (to approximately 1500 members), all with the efforts of an amazing group of volunteers who give their time and assist across many aspects of our club. From our patrollers who help keep our community safe at the beach, to our incredible training team and to our wonderful teams who assist with our Nippers Education Program our club strives ahead with community at the forefront.



Our club has numerous activities open to the wider community – boot camps, yoga, social gatherings – it is a great venue to come and connect with others. It is also lovely to see the open water swim groups - the Mussels, Dolphins, Belugas, Jellyfish, Little Rippers Learn to Swim (and others!) continue to gather at the club and share their passion for the open water. The hall hire continues to be popular and an additional source of revenue for the club - a huge thank you to Cara McMahon who volunteers to make this happen for this club! We were also delighted to welcome a school holiday program Library visit at our beach.

The club continues to work closely with Council to hire out beach wheelchairs and walkers – this offers people with mobility challenges the opportunity to enter the water.

Thank you to the rest of the committee for your tireless contributions to your departments. We thank everyone who has put up their hand and volunteered their expertise and time to make our club the inclusive and welcoming environment it is.

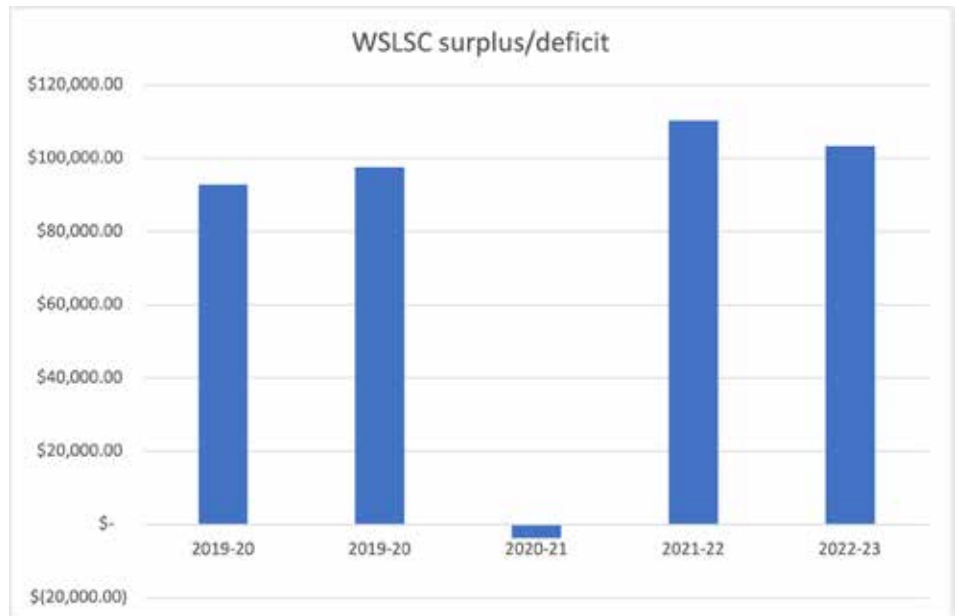




## Treasurer Report

The 2022/23 season has been an important year for the club as activities return to a 'normal' following a few seasons impacted by Covid restrictions. Revenue and expenditure were similar to the 2021/22 season. The drop in government support revenue was offset by increased club fundraising activities. The end result was a surplus of \$103,314 (2021/22 season had a surplus of \$110,371), with bank balances increasing to \$750,693 from \$671,788 the previous year.

The following is a summary of financial results for the past five seasons.



Revenue for the 2022/23 season increased approximately 10% mainly due to additional club events and merchandise sales. In terms of expenditure there has been an increase in wages/superannuation costs as a result of changes to superannuation legislation (in particular the threshold for paying superannuation being lower) and the investment the club has been making in recent years in paid staff roles to assist administration and accounting. This will assist the club in dealing with challenges associate with the redevelopment of facilities including the anticipated growth in membership once the new facilities open.

As this is my last season as club treasurer I would like to acknowledge the contribution members make to the club in volunteering their time in all aspects of the club. Volunteer hours are hard to include in the club financial report, but the surpluses the club has been achieving are a direct result of member contributions. Thank you also to the Board for the commitment to sound financial planning and management. This has been especially valuable at a time the club is making decisions about the future of the club as part of the facilities redevelopment. A big thank you also to the club accounts officer, Daria Hewitt, for her commitment to the role (and club) and who has been an excellent source of advice.

The surplus for the year ended 30 April 2023 amounted to \$103,314.


### Going Concern



### Independent Auditors Report to the members of the Association

We have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report, of Williamstown SLSC (the association), which comprises the committee's report, the assets and liabilities statement as at 30 April 2023, the income and expenditure statement for the year then ended, cash flow statement, notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, and the certification by members of the committee on the annual statements giving a true and fair view of the financial position and performance of the association.

### Committee's Responsibility for the Financial Report

# Notes to the Financial Statements

## Williamstown SLSC

### For the year ended 30 April 2023

#### 1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (Vic). The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

#### Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and property, plant and equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

#### Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

#### Cash on Hand

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

#### Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

#### Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

## Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

## Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

Once again Williamstown Swimming and Lifesaving Club has had an exemplary season meeting and exceeding all our obligations and most importantly, no lives lost at Williamstown beach.

Prior to the start of the season Life Saving Victoria implemented new patrol times and a variation of the inclement weather patrol arrangements. During the peak patrol season patrols would start at 10:00 and run until 19:00 hours. This was in response to multiple cases in recent history where an incident has occurred at a patrolled beach during these extended hours but there were no lifesavers available. WS&LSC agreed to trial the new times and achieved 100% compliance. We were also one of only 10 clubs who mounted a patrol on Christmas Day thanks to Bruce Collins, Ian Barclay and Nai Phyo.

Due to our location, it is important that WS&LSC is able to mount some form of patrol during those hot midweek days when Melbournians flock to the beach to seek some form of respite from the heat. Once again our patrollers came through responding to the call to offer their time to keep our beach safe.

WS&LSC continued the 'informal' patrol rostering system implemented a couple of years ago. Thankfully, Jason Thurley managed this side of our operations very successfully and all credit goes to him. If this system of rostering is to continue, members must make themselves available where possible and respond to calls to submit their availability in a timely manner.

The flip side to LSV's request for extended patrol times was the introduction of the 'Low Patronage Patrol' when the weather forecast was for less than ideal conditions. This meant we didn't have members hanging around in the cold and rain when there was no one on the beach.

WS&LSC was able to support members with opportunities to extend their skills, experience and personal development. Brydie Logan and Nick Franklin participated in the LSV Advanced Lifesaving Camp preparing them for opportunities to become professional Lifeguards and leaders on our patrols. Mackenzie Bull and Emily Smith will be attending the same camp later this year. We also sent Rebecca Cameron, Jo Bramble and Chloe Takac to the First Aid Trainers Conference in Queensland. WS&LSC is keen to continue this support of our members and I encourage anyone who wishes to build their skills, knowledge and understanding to reachout to the committee and request assistance.

Our club vehicle was exchanged for a new Isuzu DMax thanks to the support of Isuzu Australia. And LSV came to the rescue after our club ATV was damaged with a replacement while ours was off for repairs. I will take this opportunity to remind members these are high profile vehicles and all care and responsibility must be taken when using them.

A key part of our success in lifesaving operations lies with the efforts of our training team. Over the past couple of years nothing has been easy for them. With the restrictions of COVID lifted, it was poor water quality preventing any water based training or skills maintenance early in the season. Rebecca and her team were able to make the necessary adjustments and get everyone through. Few clubs in Australia offer the same number of opportunities to extend or maintain member's skills like Williamstown and we should be proud of our trainers' efforts.

Over the past few years the number of WS&LSC members involved with LSV operations have increased significantly. We have members working as professional lifeguards around the state. We also have members on the Jet Skis (RWC), LSV Comms, Drone Services and the Westpac Helicopter. Many of these roles are also voluntary, meaning these WS&SLC members contribute significantly to the overall state lifesaving patrolling services, something that as a club, we are very proud of. We encourage all our members to enhance their skills and knowledge through lifesaving and look forward to supporting anyone who would like to explore these other areas of lifesaving in future seasons.

The community must remember the beach is patrolled by volunteers. On behalf of the committee and the public who swim at Williamstown beach, I wish to thank every patrolling member for their efforts over the summer.

## Training

Club member interest in training continued to increase this season. The training buzz seemed to be infectious – every time we finished a course, there were more enquiries about when we would be starting the next course. Despite the constant disruption caused by Melbourne's erratic weather conditions and the resulting extended periods of poor water quality training activities continued to be delivered, with 16 courses and a barrage of skills maintenance sessions completed at the club during the season. 193 awards/ courses were obtained by WSLSC members this season, many at Williamstown and some at LSV or other clubs. This is an outstanding achievement - congratulations and thank you.

**Skills Maintenance:** Let's just say that this season Skills Maintenance was messy. Poor weather and shocking water quality meant that many members had to make multiple trips to the club to finish their required skills maintenance before the extended 31 January 2023 deadline. And even then, some SM was also completed after this time and we still have some partially completed cards. The club processed a total of 339 awards, for 155 members including BM, SRC, ART, IRBC, IRBD, and SSV. In addition to our own members, WSLSC hosted approximately 40 members from other clubs for SM assessments. Special thanks go to all the members of the training team for being available across so many sessions to ensure that as many members as possible were signed off this season. Members please note – in order to manage the SM workload and ensure we can complete the SM process in advance of the end of the year crowds on the beach - we are planning a more streamlined approach to SM for the 2023-2024 season. So please make sure you attend the advertised sessions as early in the season as possible.

**Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC):** Once again, a pre-Christmas SRC course was run at Williamstown. Demand for course enrolments was high and we ended up running two concurrent cohorts of participants. 15 of our enthusiastic younger club members were joined by one Altona LSC member, 2 Ocean Grove SLSC members, 2 Venus Bay members and two new WSLSC members participating in the course via LSV's Cultural and Linguistically Diverse (CALD) program. A range of open water, beach, pool, technology and theory sessions ensure that the candidates gained a sound base for rescue and resuscitation skills. Once again – enormous thanks to the training team for accommodating this weekday course at such a busy time of year and for Andrew Campbell and Michael Masseni from LSV for assisting our CALD candidates through the week. It has been fantastic to see the teamwork and friendship groups formed during the course extend into active patrolling during the season. We were also very proud to see 5 of the 6 podium finishers in the Youth Women's Belt and Reel at the 2022-2023 State Championships were participants of this course. As a reminder to all our SRC award holders from this year and last year, please ensure you maintain your rescue and resuscitation via skills maintenance in the lead up to the 2023-2024 season and keep up your volunteer patrol duties if you wish to undertake the Bronze Medallion Bridging Course once you are 15 years old. For junior club members who have recently turned 13, or will be turning 13 in the coming months, look out for the next SRC course in the lead-up to next season.

**Bronze Medallion:** This season, the club offered three opportunities for members to gain the Bronze Medallion award. Two cohorts undertook standard Bronze courses starting mid-September 2022 and late January 2023 and one cohort of SRC award holders attempted the club's very first Bronze Medallion Bridging course in Late January 2023. Many of the participants needed to obtain their BM to represent the club in various beach, open water/





surf and surf boat carnivals this season. We also had an increasing number of Junior competition team and Nipper parents keen to upskill and assist with water safety duties. And some other participants have been assisting with water safety for the Grey Medallion program. Once again these courses were disrupted by weather and water quality issues. However, we were fortunate to be able to continue water-based training in a combination of the club pool and at Bayfit Altona. It was fantastic to see some of these new Bronzies on the podiums at carnivals and championship events. Special thanks to the training team members who make themselves available for these courses in addition to meeting your own volunteer patrolling hours and competition training and carnival commitments.

**IRB (inflatable rescue boats) crew and driver courses:** The club intended to hold IRB crew and driver courses in November 2022 but the sudden onset of very poor water quality in Port Phillip Bay prevented us from putting the inflatable rescue boats in the water at Williamstown. After completing only the theory component both the crew and driver courses were abandoned. Two new courses were commenced in late January with 3 days scheduled at the club and the final day down in the surf at Ocean Grove. Once again the IRB comp team assisted with the surf day provided all course participants valuable time in the surf conditions. This year's crew and driver courses added a new crew and three new drivers to the U23 IRB team and a further new crew and driver available to assist with general patrol and water safety duties. Thank you to the IRB trainers and trainee trainers for working with the course candidates to build their confidence and skills in a variety of water conditions.

**Silver Medallion Patrol Captain:** The club held its very first SMPC course this season. This new course replaces the Silver Medallion Beach Management award. The SMPC course is dedicated to developing the leadership skillsets of experienced patrollers to ensure they can effectively manage the resources of the patrol team and successfully respond to beach events and emergencies. The course was expertly facilitated by WSLSC member, Joel Farrow, and Kimberley Gee from Venus Bay. Joel has also assisted Kimberley deliver a SMPC course at Venus Bay. The course graduates were very grateful for the experiences gained during this course and the detailed individual feedback on performances in the scenario-based assessments. All participants commented on how much they learned from the course and that the new course is a significant improvement from the older SMBM course. ### **Resuscitation (CPR), First Aid (FA) and Advanced Resuscitation**

**Techniques (ART):** Demand for the health-related awards remained strong at the Club this year resulting in 4 CPR courses and 2 combined ART/FA courses being offered. We were also joined by a number of members from other Clubs during these courses. We are so proud of the number of members undertaking accredited health courses at the club (and at LSV HQ or with other community training providers) and the increase in visibility of these non-water based courses has resulted in members from across the various club interest areas coming together to up-skill and support the club and the broader community. Your willingness to undertake training at the club has also been instrumental in seeking ways to maintain and build the training team delivering these accredited course units. We currently have three trainee trainers working their way towards 'training under supervision', one trainer working towards gaining the accredited assessor units and a couple of members taking up Cert IV courses opportunities with the assistance of LSV. The ability to run CPR courses in association with Skills Maintenance sessions and the longer ART/FA courses proved convenient – look out for those same opportunities in the lead up to the 2023-2024 season. As you can see from the new / renewed awards below, the club will be in a strong position to fill the FA and ART patrol rosters. As usual – we could not deliver any of these courses without the wonderful Jo Bramble (thank you a million times over for shouldering this massive responsibility for the club for another season).

**New Equipment and Professional Development:** As part of our grant expenditure, the club purchased an upgraded baby manikin. This new manikin has lungs and chest cavity, similar to our adult manikins and allows real-time feedback on both rescue breaths and compression depth, recoil and hand position. This equipment has already been used in courses and as part of the club's interactive display at the Newport Islamic Centre's Emergency Services Career Expo.

The club assisted three members of our training team attend the National Institute of First Aid Trainers (NIFAT) conference in August 2022. The conference provided opportunities to learn about a range of topics relevant to our patrol and training activities, including: community responses to sudden cardiac arrest; effective first aid training strategies; the use of realistic simulations in training; updates on research and best practice emergency treatment of burns, poisonings, infant and child resuscitation, and defibrillation; learnings from coronial inquests into deaths from anaphylaxis; and awareness and experiences of PTSD. Many of the very interesting key points from the conference have already been integrated into the training and first aid treatments delivered at the club over summer. On behalf of those who participated in this PD program, thanks go to the club for this opportunity to meet with a wide range of first-aid trainers, responders and researchers. It has enabled us to understand where and how we can improve our first aid treatments and training of first aid and to share these ideas with our broader club membership and local community.

**Accused senator quits Libs**

Victorian senator David Van has resigned from the Liberal Party amid an internal push to force him out of federal parliament over allegations of misconduct.

Van wrote to Victorian Liberal Party president Greg Misbells last night to resign from the party, saying he was deeply distressed and hurt that he had not been afforded procedural fairness over the claims.

Van has been accused by at least three women, including independent senator Lilla Thorpe and former Liberal senator Amanda Stoker, of inappropriate behaviour. He denies the allegations.

His resignation came less than 24 hours before senior members of the party's organisational wing were to meet to discuss how to force him out of the party.

## Williamstown Open Water Schools Program

This season the WOW School programs commenced on November 16th this season with St Marys Williamstown, followed by first timers Mossfield Primary School. We had all our local primary schools returning for their beach programs – Williamstown, Willy North, Newport Gardens, St Leo the Great, Sacred Heart, Newport Lakes as well as Kensington PS returning for the second year, and Salt Water College for their 3rd year. Other first time schools include Flemington PS, and Westbourne Grammar, and Newmark Primary attended for their weekly surf skills and sports. All in all, that's about 1630 students that attended our WOW School Programs (with many attended for 2 days too)!

Unfortunately the “la nina” weather pattern wasn't always kind to the students and several sessions had to be cancelled or shortened, or adapted for the water conditions and quality, but like every good lifesaver, our students and coaches were up for the challenge and used their skills and energy to make the sessions fun and educational.

During the programs, students are educated on aquatic safety and get the chance to practice their skills in paddling a nipper board and body board, beach flags, learning how to wade in the open water and pool safety skills, as well as life saving skills (CPR, first aid), survival skills with life jackets, and of course fun games and teamwork.

Our coaches are all bronze medallion holders, keen to impart their knowledge and skills on our visiting students, and consequently making it safer for them and their families when they visit the beach.

With our program, we also offer Victorian Water Safety Certificate assessment for any schools that are interested, and are accredited for Sporting Schools funding.

A big thank you to all our coaches, and especially our team leaders this season – Tom and Nick Frisby, Emmet Keough, Brydie Logan and Charlotte Drake and of course our lifeguards who are also required for us to use the pool.

We are fully booked for term 4 once again from November 13th, with some vacancies still in February and March. We also rent the pool for school carnivals and really host St Marys and Williamstown Primary for these events.

Expressions for Interest for coaching for season 23/24 will be advertised in Team App in September, with October training evening. We would love to have any bronze medallion holder (minimum 16 years) interested in coaching too, so please look out for the EOI later this year.

### SLSA Surf Lottery

This year WS&LSC signed up to partake in the SLSA Surf Lottery Foundation ongoing fundraising.

The SLSA Surf Lottery is held approximately every 2 months, with \$2 tickets being sold for beachside homes in Queensland – Gold Coast and Sunshine Coast. This has traditionally been a Queensland activity with SLSA Foundation raffling these properties off to raise money for surf lifesaving with all of the money usually going directly to SLSA. With our new contract with SLSA Surf Lottery, you can now buy raffle tickets for the amazing prizes directly from our website or through a QR code (see below) or various flyers around the club house, and 50% of these profits then go towards WS&LSC directly. To date we are close to the first marker of \$1000 of fundraising, but hope to raise more over the year. Reminders of ticket draws will be communicated regularly by Team App and social media.





## WOW Championships

A total of 412 swimmers registered for the WOW challenge for 2023, and the smooth operation of the event was made possible by the dedicated efforts of 150 volunteers both on land and in the water. The early morning start allowed swimmers to take full advantage of the favourable conditions. As the morning progressed, a slight wind change added an exciting element to the challenge, living up to its name and providing a thrilling final lap for the participants in the 10km event.

An exciting addition to the 2023 WOW Challenge was the introduction of separate divisions for wetsuit and non-wetsuit swimmers in the main event. This division allowed non-wetsuit swimmers to have their results included on the Marathon Swimming Federation's database, giving the event international recognition.

In the non-wetsuit division, Clara Piccinelli, a 16-year-old newcomer to the 10km event, emerged as the 1st place winner in the Female-Identifying category. Clara achieved an impressive time of 2 hours, 49 minutes, and 50 seconds. Brenda Norman, the featured swimmer of 2023, closely followed Clara, finishing with a time of 2 hours, 51 minutes, and 6 seconds.

A highlight of the day was the intense competition between veteran John van Wisse and national champion Ben Morrison in the 10km event. These two exceptional swimmers engaged in a thrilling stroke-for-stroke battle throughout the entire morning. In the end, John van Wisse emerged as the victor, crossing the finish line just 1 minute and 11 seconds ahead of Ben. Both John and Ben deserve a special thank you for providing such an entertaining race.

Congratulations were extended to all the winners across every category and distance. The event witnessed some remarkable swims, and the atmosphere both in and out of the water was nothing short of magnificent. The organisers also expressed their gratitude to the dedicated army of volunteers who tirelessly worked from the early hours of the morning until the event's conclusion at 5:30 PM.

## Silver Salties

Silver Salties are a new group at WS&LSC, which started back in October 2022. Silver Salties is an initiative created by Surf Life Saving Australia, with the aim of encouraging older people to engage in physical fitness, enhance social connections and get involved in the surf lifesaving community. SLSA have guidelines to follow to ensure swimmers enter the water safely, they also provide insurance cover for all registered participants.

Our group at Williamstown has grown to nearly 50 members. We meet each Friday morning at 10:00am at the club house, swimming skills are at all levels. Some swim far, some stay in the shallows practising their stroke skills, and everything in between. Although we started in the warmer months there is a desire to swim though winter, so far so good.

We are also a very social group too, for example we jumped on the ferry and went to Geelong for a swim at Eastern Beach, caught the train to have lunch in Seymour and then Castlemaine.

With thanks to Doreen from Carmenbody Yoga, yoga sessions are also available through the program.

The Silver Salties have also hooked up with Life Saving Victoria and conducted fully funded training, for example Resuscitate a Mate and Intermediate Grey Medallion program. These programs created a greater awareness of basic lifesaving skills and beach safety for the participants.
